
Over 60% of protests in 2017 related to municipal services and governance Civic Protest Barometer 2018

South Africa's leading monitor of civic protests

The Civic Protest Barometer (CPB) tracks <u>civic protests</u> across South Africa, which are a specific form of protest, directed at municipalities.

While nationally the number of civic protests in 2017 reached the lowest level in three years (CPB 2018 Fact Sheet #1 (nr of protests), the pattern shown in the type of grievances underlying the civic protests is consistent with that established in earlier CPBs.

The Barometer shows

- The most prominent category of grievance cited by protesters relates to municipal services (56%).
- 13% per cent of grievances can be attributed to **municipal governance** issues.
- 17% of grievances relate to socio-economic issues like unemployment and landlessness directed at local government as a proxy of the state.

The 2018 edition of the Civic Protest Barometer (CPB) will be published in February with further detailed analysis of these and other findings.
