



### A Thrilling Start to the Season!

We're excited to share some fantastic developments in our international water polo calendar for 2025.

Last month, six of our national age group teams made history by participating in the inaugural Africa Aquatics Development Water Polo Tournament, hosted by the Zimbabwe Water Polo Board of Control in Harare.


This milestone event gave our selectors and coaching staff valuable insights and a chance to scout emerging talent for our U16 and U18 squads—laying the groundwork for the 2026 World Championships.

Hot off the heels of our Senior National Championships, our under 20 and Senior Men's and Ladies' National Teams have been selected – fierce, focused, and ready to represent South Africa at their respective World Championships in the coming months: U20 Men's Team – Competing in June at the U20 Men's World Championships in Zagreb, Croatia

- Senior Men's and Women's Teams In action this July at the Aquatics World Championships in Singapore
- U20 Women's Team Heading to Salvador, Brazil this August for the U20 Women's World Championships

Over 2,500 athletes are expected to participate at these World Aquatics Championships, representing World Aquatics' 210 national member federations across the six aquatic sports.

We extend our heartfelt congratulations to all athletes selected to wear the green and gold. Your dedication and hard work continue to inspire, and we wish you every success as you prepare to represent South Africa on the international stage.

### National Currie Cup Water Polo Tournament 2025: Showcasing Mnansi

April 2025 saw **the most successful national tournament** in recent memory.

From breathtaking saves to edge-of-yourseat goals, the energy was unmatched.

Buffalo City Aquatics and Swim South Africa proudly hosted both the Senior Men's and Ladies' National Currie Cup tournaments from 26–28 April 2025 at the Joan Harrison Pool Complex in East London.

The event brought together 8 Men's and 6 Ladies' franchise teams, featuring some of the top U20 and senior water polo players from across South Africa.

As a key event on the national calendar, Currie Cup serves as the primary selection platform for our National Teams set to compete in the 2025.

### U17 Squads Make a Strong Impression

This year marked an exciting milestone with the inclusion of the South African U17 Boys' and Girls' squads. Despite facing tough

opposition, these young athletes delivered impressive performances and demonstrated strong potential. Their participation provided national selectors with valuable insight into the future of South African water polo and contributed to the long-term vision for the 2028 Olympic cycle.


### **Rule Changes**

The tournament kicked off on Friday evening with a well-attended technical meeting for coaches and managers.

- Mr. Lionel Poovan, President of Buffalo City Aquatics, welcomed all participants.
- Mr. Dion Willis, Head Referee and Convenor of the SA Water Polo Technical Committee, introduced newly adopted rule changes that will align South African teams with international standards ahead of the World Championships.

### **New Developments**

 The timing system for previously disadvantaged players was omitted with the aim of promoting fairness and equality organically.
We are pleased to report that the change was embraced in the true spirit of the game.


